10: Please give us your overall impression of this exchange and let us know what you think to have gained from this 'Erasmus experience'.

Haarlem:

- I had a wonderful time here in Holland! This exchange gave me the opportunity to interact with students from different countries and I learnt quite a lot. It is a very good place to stay as there are lots of things to do. The programme was interesting and I have a much better idea of ultrasound now. I would definitely recommend Holland to next years students as I would like them to have a wonderful time just like I did.
- It has been a good program, we learnt a lot of anatomy, pathology and were able to practise a lot at school. He problem based learning worked very well, but we are used to in n Norway. It is positive that we had the Dutch course at the start,
- I had a very good time here. Wish we could stay longer. Have learned a lot about ultrasound and had a lot of fun. It has been very nice living in Zandvoort with the other exchange students. We have made friends for life. A good organized course. The teachers and Dutch students have been very helpful. I will recommend Haarlem.
- I enjoyed this exchange and I would recommend it to all students who want to learn and study in a different country, make new friends from all over the world and understand what it means to be independent. It was nice doing ultrasound as we did a lot of practise an I also enjoyed going around Holland and living it unique lifestyle
- The Erasmus experience was one of the best experiences in my life!!
- I have really enjoyed my time in Holland. The equipment in school whilst not up to date is excellent in comparison with my own school. In Ipswich we don't have ultrasound, just one antique plain x ray tube. Zandvoort is beautiful)although cold and windy'. The school and hospital seem to work in a much more integrated way. It is amazing to me how the radiologists talk to other staff as equals. None of this elitist 'them and us' attitude. Language has not been a barrier at all.

- The contact with other people, culture, places. Dutch patients, students and teachers was very nice. I spent a lot of good times in the Netherlands. I learnt a lot of things about radiotherapy and now I have notions about things I did not have before. I had the opportunity to work with the equipment in the school with time enough to work and without stress. This was good, very nice, wonderful. Today I feel this school and all people like my second home and family. Here I spent a great time and I did not learn only things in the school. I learnt about the country (history, language, traditional behaviour. This made me grow up a lot. The school has great conditions and everybody was very nice. The MCA therapy department is great and a good place. Staff did not see me like a student but took care of me and saw me like a partner, gave me responsibilities I never have in Portugal. This was wonderful for me as future 'laborant' and like a person. I hope to come back here to see the new school of health, the department in MCA, the flowers, snow, windmills, clogs, bicycles and the Grote Markt in Haarlem again. I hope other Portuguese students will have the same opportunities I had. Dank u wel! Tot ziens.

Eindhoven:

- This exchange has proven to be a rewarding three months. On a personal level I have made many new friends and have seen/experienced a wide spectrum of Holland and its culture. In terms of MRI I arrived with practically no knowledge, but feel going home with good base knowledge. From the clinical perspective the Erasmus exchange allowed me to compare hospitals with my own country and to take note of how things are done differently. This sharing of ideas is good for all partners.
- This Erasmus exchange to Eindhoven has been very satisfactory in many aspects. Academically it has been very good, although I have to admit that MRI is quite difficult. But school facilities and teaching hold a high quality. The staff at school has been very nice. Except from the academical aspects I have to say that I like Eindhoven and the Netherlands. Nice people, good food and restaurants. Clinical placement was very good.
- I very much liked this exchange program. It was nice to know new people from other countries and also know their style of living. The lectures at school were very well organized, but I expected to learn a little bit more about MRI, especially some specific examinations. I think I can only recommend this exchange programme to other students at home and I am happy that I have chosen Fontys University.
- I really enjoyed my time and experience here in Holland. Having come here without prior knowledge of MRI and the Dutch language I feel that I have gained a vast amount of information on both topics. Lectures and the PBL system of learning was a new experience and I feel that it was very educational and is a very effective way of learning. Assignment, feedback sessions were very good also as it reinforced knowledge on MRI learned. Clinical experience was very good as the department was well prepared for me coming. The staff were very receptive and helpful, answering all questions asked. Overall Erasmus 2003 was a very enjoyable and memorable experience.
- I really enjoyed this exchange I found the course extremely interesting and it will greatly benefit my studies next year when we begin to study it in Dublin. The facilities were excellent and the standard of teaching was also excellent. I enjoyed living here for three months, experiencing a different culture.. It was very easy to get by with English and a small bit of Dutch and the people were helpful and friendly. Most things, like food, accommodation and transport were much cheaper than at home. I would definitely like to return to Holland one day.

- I got basic knowledge of a very complicated subject, MRI! Cultural, academic, clinical awareness of the country to compare with home country. Very interesting. Gained very nice friendships with other students in the Erasmus scheme and Dutch students/staff in academic institution, clinical setting etc.
- I thoroughly enjoyed the Erasmus experience, culturally, educationally and socially. I learnt a lot about MRI, even more in clinical practice because it allowed me to put my knowledge into practice. The exchange also allowed me to experience the cultural differences between Holland and Ireland. It also allowed me to see the difference between the Irish and Dutch health systems, which turned out to be quite different. I also got to travel a lot and therefore I became much more independent.. However it was a pity that we did not have more interaction with the Dutch students, as our Erasmus group was very small.

Turku:

- I really enjoyed my stay here in Finland. I learned a lot about culture, language, habits, people and so on. In clinical placements I did not learn really much, but that's because I already know a lot. But I did see interesting things. I met a lot of new people and got to know them well. I made some new good friends. Also I went with IAC to Lapland. That was absolutely great. The IAC is in total good. They arranged a lot. I did see some other parts of Finland, than only just Turku. Also the activities for exchange students were arranged very well and with the activities I had also a good time. Hereby I want to thank the ERASMUS organization for making this possible.

Dublin:

- I really had a great time here! I expected more free time to travel around in the weekends and during the week. I also expected more of the lectures and the work we could do in the hospital. The Erasmus coordinator in Ireland organized a lot of things and tried to make us feel very comfortable. Many thanks to Desiree O'Leary and the family where I lived.

The school time has been good. I would have liked to have more time off, so that we could have time to travel more during our stay. Since we have had so many lectures in school I feel that I haven't had enough time to see all I wanted. Overall I have had a really good time here and I will definitely recommend it to other students in Bergen and friends and family as well.

- We got mail/letters that we had to wear white shoes here. Make sure that does not happen next year and tell the next Erasmus students to bring a dress so they can have the chance to go to the ball. Overall impression B+. Thank you for hosting. I had the time of my life!!

Malta:

- The ERASMUS programme was very well presented and planned. I really enjoyed my stay and learned many valuable aspects about Malta and its history. The ERASMUS program allowed me to mix with people from different countries and I gained many new friends. The ERASMUS programme allowed me to become more independent and I thoroughly enjoyed being a part of the ERASMUS exchange.
- I think the exchange in Malta is arranged good. The lectures are interesting. We had to do some assignments, but I think everybody could do that. The pharmacology was not difficult to understand and relevant for my job. The other sections had a great additional value, like primary health care and quality assurance and EU legislation. The Maltese language and history and culture was nice to learn, because we are here for three months. I think the variety in the clinical placement is big. Every week I was in a different room in the hospital. That was a good way to get a total impression of the way of working in the hospital of Malta. My overall impression is good. I think I learnt a lot of things like the Maltese way of working. Not only the Maltese culture but also the English language. I also improved my own development.
- My overall impression is very good. Everything was arranged very well. When there were problems or when I had questions there was always someone to help me. I did not have bad experiences. The Maltese culture is less strict than the Dutch culture, but I really liked that part of Malta. It was also very good that I repeated as much examinations as possible in my clinical placements. It was one great experience these three months!
- I think for me it was a great experience, because I learnt a lot of new things, culture language, clinical placement and I really enjoyed my stay, but it was a bit expensive (Coimbra)
- It was a nice experience and I never regret that I participated. The course was well organized and the teachers were very helpful at all times.
- It was very nice that we had Maltese language and culture/history lessons and the trips around the islands were very educational. Only disadvantage was that Malta is a bit more expensive than Holland.
- Everything was well organized and I felt that I was taken care of. Education in Malta is good. The quality is high. The degree in radiography is comparable with one in Finland, so I felt that the things I learnt here are really valuable..
- I feel I gained a lot of valuable clinical experience, particularly in areas such as mammography, CT and MRI, because we have not started our training in these areas yet. The courses and lectures were well organized, with each lecture being relevant to our course. I found Maltese language a little difficult but enjoyable at the same time. The lecturers and organizers like after us well and were very approachable. (Dublin)
- I really enjoyed my Erasmus experience in Malta. The academic and clinical components were well designed and timetabled and relevant to my choices at home. The social and cultural activities organized for the ERASMUS group gave a good taste of Maltese life. We learned much about the history of the Maltese Islands and also had the opportunity to learn some Maltese which helped us a lot to settle in to the clinical placement. Our accommodation was good and the travel time to lectures and hospital

quite short. As a group and individually we were made very welcome in Malta and I would recommend the ERASMUS programme to all students (Dublin)

- I was unsure what to expect coming to Malta. I expected the life there would be typically Mediterranean but it was not really unlike home. I enjoyed the experience of living in a different country for three months as I have not stayed away from home for that long before. I also got to know the other ERASMUS students quite well and also learned some cultural differences. Regarding clinical placement I used that to visit the modalities in the department, because I have not a lot of experience in these areas such as CT or MRI. I thought the pharmacology lecture was beneficial, even though we cannot administer contrast in Ireland. It was useful to learn background information anyway.

Coimbra:

- I think that Portugal is a very beautiful country and the people are very nice and kind, but three months was a very short time.
- It was very nice to be here in Portugal and everything was good organized. It was nice to meet different people from different countries with different behaviour and I learned a lot about they work in other hospitals.
- I had a very nice time here in Portugal and I do not regret going here. I can mention that the accommodation should have a washing machine, but except for that everything has been great and I can recommend this program for later students.
- Very nice experience. Portugal is beautiful and interesting. Program in school and placement was excellent!
- I am very satisfied with my stay here in Portugal! It has been very nice to meet many new people and to see this beautiful country. I have learned many things about differences between Norway and Portugal when it comes to culture and health service. The program is good and the teachers were relevant. I think I have grown a lot on this experience and will treasure this memory for the years to come.
- When I arrived in Coimbra my expectations were a little bit low, especially about our staying and apartment. The reason for this was because last year I picked up two Maltese students at the airport in Holland and lead them to their Erasmus apartment. It was a very poor apartment out of the city.
