RAD320 Professional and behavioral aspects of patient care in radiography

The incoming students will work together with the Norwegian students in this course. The Norwegian students will be in their 6th semester.

This subject focuses on aspects of the Radiographer's role, tasks and responsibilities when interacting with the patient, next of kin or other health personnel. The study of chosen topics that deal with the radiographer's professionalism and behavior as a caregiver will give the student an opportunity to reflect upon situations where different considerations and demands must be weighed up against one another in decision-making processes. The subject deals with communication, conflicts of values, ethical dilemmas, respect and reflection, and factors

affecting the Radiographer as a professional practitioner. These challenges are studied on individual basis, group basis and on society basis.

FHSU302 The Norwegian Health Care System in an International Perspective, and patient communication in Norwegian

This course is for incoming exchange students to Bachelor in Radiography program only. The course focuses on the Norwegian health care system and the ethical conduct of the professional practice. The objective of this course is to gain insight into the Norwegian health care system and in relation to the health care systems of the countries of the incoming students. Another objective is for the students to be able to communicate in Norwegian with the patients and colleagues in a radiology/radiotherapy department. A student who has completed the course should have the following learning outcomes defined in terms of knowledge, skills and general competence:

U5NOR13 Norwegian for incoming students

Norwegian for foreign students. Beginners' course is directed towards foreign students studying at the Western Norway University of Applied Sciences, campus Bergen, for three months or more. There may be max 21 students in the class. The course requires no previous knowledge of Norwegian. The students must be sufficiently proficient in English to understand instructions in English.

The course focuses on training of communicative skills in Norwegian, first and foremost listening and speaking. The communicative training will deal with everyday situations/speech acts.

RADP5 Clinical practice - Advanced patient care

The practical study-period is a part of the ERASMUS program, an exchange program for the Bachelor degree in Radiography. The program consists of the theoretical subject RAD320 (7,5 ECTS) Behavioral and Professional Aspects of Patient Care in Radiography, RADP5 (7,5 ECTS) the clinical period, in addition to FHSUR300 (3 ECTS) The Norwegian Health Care System in an International Perspective.

The course is offered twice a year, starting in August and January. The course is completed with an oral exam.
